HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

S.G.K. Government Degree College, Vinukonda was established to serve the higher education needs of the academically backward Palnadu region. It is located on the outskirts of Vinukonda, a small town in Palnadu District (erstwhile Guntur District). It is the only government degree college catering the academic aspirations of the young hopefuls residing in about 75 kms radius. Till 1979, students who were desirous of pursuing higher education were moving to far off places. The philanthropic intervention of Sri Gangineni Venkateswara Rao, Ex- MLA, Sri O. Venkateswarlu, Ex- MLA and Dr. V. Adi Reddy could realize the higher education dreams of the students on 11th September, 1980. Initially, it rendered it's services in the name of Madala Satyannarayana and Manne Rathamma Government Degree College and later re-named after its donor and former Principal Smt. Gangineni Kalyani (late).

The college is sprawled out over 38 acres of vast land area and eco-friendly environment. It provides spacious and aerated classrooms, fully equipped laboratories, well-structured and arranged library with 13500 books and reading room, modern gymnasium, virtual lab, English language lab, JKC for skill development, which are all well supported by serene and iconic ambience. The college takes pride by offering quality education to students from the competent and qualified teaching faculty. The college has 22 sanctioned teaching posts, including Principal. Of them, Four faculty members have Doctoral degrees in their respective subjects, one has M.Phil. Degree and all the lecturers have qualified in NET/SLET/SET.

The college achieved the status of 2(f) and 12(B) in 1994. For the quality education it has been imparting for the last 42 years (Ruby Jubilee), strictly adhering to the guidelines of UGC, it has been conferred with NAAC „B“ Grade twice (2006 & 2016).

SWOC ANALYSIS

STRENGTHS:

- ☑ Our college is the only Government Degree College in Vinukonda assembly constituency. Established 43 years ago, this caters the needs of students who reside in 40 KM radius around vinukonda town.
- ☑ Every Regular faculty, apart from having experience and teaching skills is qualified in NET/SET conducted by UGC or is a Doctorate holder.
- ☑ Our college takes pride in being the only college in vinukonda region having good infrastructural facilities. Apart from Well equipped Labs for various subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Zoology and Botany, we also have English Language Lab to improve Communication skills of students. Well furnished Gymnasium, campus sprawling in 38 acres are big assets for sports and health savvy students.
- ☑ Every Lecturer uses ICT tools extensively both in teaching and assessment thus making the process of teaching interesting and interactive. We have four digital classrooms for the Lecturers to utilize.
- ☑ We are ISO certified and is deemed to be having Environmental friendly campus by NAAC peer team of Cycle 2 and is also ISO 14001-2015 certified(ISO 14001:2015 should be used by any organization that wishes to set up, improve, or maintain an environmental management system to conform with its established environmental policy and requirements).

WEAKNESSES:

- ☑ Our college is located in the outskirts of the town. Public transport facilities are also not adequate to reach the college on time. This has been one of the reasons for low Girl student ratio in the college.
- ☑ There is no college attached Hostel facility for both Men and Women. Many parents, especially parents of girls are demanding for Hostel facility within the college to admit their children.
- ☑ Although the college secured „B“ grade in Cycle 2 of NAAC, we lack funding from RUSA. Many of the infrastructural facilities are not updated due to lack of funding.
- ☑ There are a total of 11 classrooms to teach students from 8 different programs. This is inhibiting us from starting new courses and introducing Post Graduate programs in the college.
- ☑ We are using Virtual Classroom as seminar hall in the college. It is very small to accommodate all the students of the college. Lack of auditorium is making it difficult to conduct some of the events for all the students at a time.

OPPORTUNITIES:

- ☑ We are the only college in vinukonda region which conducts Job Drives every year. This is a good platform for job seekers in and around vinukonda. Students who utilize this opportunity can start a good career after completion of their Degree.
- ☑ We have a land area of 38 acres. If properly landscaped, it could be utilized for installing running tracks, sports complexes, Botanical gardens and many other facilities which could result in all-round development of the student.
- ☑ We have a strong Physical Education Department with Regular Physical Director which opens up new opportunities for students to participate in National and international sports events and win medals.
- ☑ Our Library is equipped with hundreds of books to prepare for various competitive examinations. Its optimal utilization by students would increase growth prospectus of their future career.
- ☑ We are diligent in adopting New Education policy into our academic framework. We have made it mandatory for students to do two Community Service Projects between I year and II year . This establishes a strong linkage between students and society and makes them understand the problems around them. This also improves their communication skills as they have to interact with public to complete their project.

CHALLENGES:

- ☑ Most of the students joining in our college are from financially weaker background. Even though they like to study, their situation demands them to find work that could atleast pay their expenses. This has resulted in increased dropout rate of students. Many, who found employment in the middle of their course, left the college for job.
- ☑ Altogether, we have 43 computer systems available in the college. These are not sufficient to meet the needs of students, departments and college office.
- ☑ Most of the students who join the college have Telugu as medium of instruction in their schooling and intermediate. All the courses offered in the college are in English medium. It has become a challenging task to teach them in English medium.
- ☑ Most of the departments in the college are running with single faculty. This is making it difficult to conduct Research activities.

Students who want to join in the Govt. Degree Colleges do not have to apply in general way. Online applications to be submitted through online mode. The Govt. of Andhra Pradesh, A.P State Council of Higher Education, Commissioner of Collegiate Education has taken a decision together to conduct A.P. Online Degree Admissions through "Online Admission Module for Degree Colleges portal" (AP-OAMDC) [https://oamdc a.p.gov.in](https://oamdc.a.p.gov.in). Students who want to study for the Degree first year, they should submit their application through new online method. The government has created an OAMDC (Online Admission Module for Degree Colleges) web portal. Students based on this portal will apply at [https:// oamdc.ap.gpv.in](https://oamdc.ap.gpv.in).

In this application, the Students will submit their details, what college are joining and what category is included in the comprehensive information. Students should provide comprehensive information in online mode.

Intermediate passed candidates in A.P or other Boards are eligible to participate in web counseling for seats available in UG Programmes in Arts, Science, Commerce, Computer Application etc,

Candidates should note that the online admission process comprising of registration, payment of processing fee and certificate verification will be conducted as per the schedule fixed by the Govt. of AP.

Applicants need to visit OAMDC website, and click on the online Application Form in its Home page you may also go through the video instruction regarding filling up of the CAF before you start the process of filling in. Now the fill –up the CAF (Common Application Form) online on the computer screen upload your recent passport size colour photograph and signature image in the space provided for the same.

Candidates will have to apply ONLINE for a maximum of FIVE options through [https://oamdc.ap.in./](https://oamdc.ap.in/) for filling up required personal academic details, choice of different colleges and structure in order of preference. After submitting the common Application Form(CAF), The applicant should take print out of the computer generated application form and attach the supporting documents as per the check list and be ready to submit while he/she got selected in a college.

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Pay application fee through online fee payment process at the time of admissions, college can accept/reject Applicant's CAF Common Application Form after Scrutiny. If the college

accepts the CAF of a student he/she should pay the fee to get the admission.

SELECTION PROCESS:

The OAMDC launched to promote merit, achieve excellence, curb malpractices, implement reservation, conduct fair, non-discriminatory and merit based admissions in a transparent basis in the large interest and welfare of the student community.

The OAMDC software shall process all applications and finalize the 1st selection list for each of the college as per the merit and choice of the applicants. The selection list shall be published on the predetermined date.

Rules for attendance and Leave of Absence

1. The college runs in two sessions daily with three periods in each session. If a student is absent without leave for a part of a session he shall lose half-a-day attendance.
2. Attendance will be taken as soon as the lecturer enters the class. No attendance will be given to those who go late to the class after clouser of the roll call.
3. Every student should put in at least 75% of attendance in the academic year.
4. No student shall be absent without leave. Leave application should be addressed to the Principal and they should be submitted through the Proctor in advance in the following form:

PROCTORIAL SCHEME

The scheme aims to facilitate the growth of the close relationship between the teachers and the taught.

Under this scheme the students are divided into different batches and each batch is kept under the care of one staff member. The latter meets his wards from time to time and guides them. The students are advised to consult their proctor with regard to all their academic and other problems. The leave application of the students will have to be submitted to the proctor for recommendation.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. The Principal of college holds power with regard to the overall discipline of the students of the college. He may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules both of temporary and permanent character regulating the conduct of the students within the campus or outside the college.
2. The Principal shall have powers to impose punishments including fines, loss of attendance, Suspension and expulsion or rustication.
3. The Principal shall place himself in communication where necessary, with the parents or Guardians of the students, who are very backward and do not show any improvement, whose attendance is very irregular or whose conduct is not satisfactory. The names of these students whose conduct found incorrigible even after intimation to the parents or guardians, shall be removed . The order of the Principal on this matter shall be final.
4. Students of the college going on strike or in any way guilty of serious indiscipline shall immediately forfeit their scholarships or fee concessions.
5. The students without prior permission of the Principal, should arrange no meeting or any programme in the campus.
6. Memorandums, complaints from individuals to any higher authority should be submitted through the Principal of the College only.

CLASS ROOM

1. On the teacher's entering the class room, the students shall rise and remain standing until
2. they are asked to sit or until the teacher takes his seat.
3. No student shall leave the class when once he enters and in case of dire necessity, shall seek the permission of the Lecturer, before leaving the class.
4. Students are expected to assemble in the classrooms before the third bell. A student entering the classroom after the third bell should seek the permission of the Lecturer.
5. Attendance will be given to the Students only if they are present in the class by the time the lecturer calls the roll number.
6. Students found outside the lecturer hall when classes are on will be dealt with very severely.

RULES OF CONDUCT

1. Smoking within the college premises is prohibited.
2. Girl teasing is punishable in terms of the government rules such as expulsion, rustication.
3. Every student shall provide himself with all the necessary textbooks and writing material.
4. Every student shall wear clean and decent dress as approved by the Principal.
5. Any student breaking or damaging any college property shall be required to pay the cost of repair or replacement of the property In the case of willful damage he shall also be punished in such a manner as the Principal may think fit.
6. Students are required to help in keeping the class rooms and premises tidy.
7. Students guilty of going over to other colleges to take part in acts of indiscipline would be punished by the principal.

LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

1. The library and Reading room shall be open on all working days from 10 AM to 1 PM AND 2pm to 5PM.
2. Books from the Library are issued to the present staff and students of the college.
3. Strict silence and decorum must be observed in Library.
4. Books will be issued to the Students only on the production of the Identity Card.
5. All the books should be surrendered to the library before the end of the academic year. T.C.,C.C.,etc., will not be issued unless the student produces "NO DUES" certificate from the library.
6. Books should be returned within 10 days from the date of issue. A student failing to return a book within the prescribed time will be fined at the rate of 50 paise per day of default. No book shall be issued further unless the fine is paid and the book returned.
7. Books will be issued as per the timetable put upon the notice board by the librarian.
8. Rare and reference books have to be referred to in the Library premises only, by the staff and students.
9. Unauthorised removal of books or other property from the Library or damage to library will be dealt with severely.
10. All the books borrowed from the library should be used carefully and no ear marking or underscoring should be done. The user concerned should replace books so mutilated.

READING ROOM

1. Strict silence and discipline should be observed in the reading room.
2. All the journals and magazines placed in the reading room should be handled with great care.
3. Marking, underlining or detaching of pages etc., is strictly prohibited.
4. The current issues of journals and periodicals shall be read in the reading room only and shall not be issued to take them home.

MANA TV

This college is provided with e-learning facility through MANA TV. Programmes on academic matters will be telecast by APSAPNET to improve academic standards.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The N.S.S. is service oriented in its functioning. Under this scheme, students undertake nation-building activities like campus development, projects, plantation, adult literacy drive etc. National Service Scheme has been functioning in this college since 1976. The JKC of our college has a very fast internet facility which provides day-to-day current information and knowledge to the students and members of Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff. English Language Lab (ELL) is also attached to the JKC. The Lab is well equipped with latest computers and softwares. The JKC of our college involves in sensitizing the students of other

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Ragging is prohibited under the ANDHRA PRADESH PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 1997 and it is also punishable under various provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860. The Regulators of higher education like UGC and AICTE have also noted promptly by making the necessary Rules and Regulations to curb the menace of ragging in all the educational institutions.

Its body at Institutional level has to establish measures for Prohibiting, Preventing and Punishing Activities of Ragging menace within and outside the campus in accordance with UGC Regulations, Supreme Court Directives and State Act. It is responsible for taking action against those found guilty of ragging and or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.

COMPOSITION OF ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The College has constituted a Committee as then Anti- Ragging Committee headed by the Head of the Institution and a diverse mix of faculty, senior students and non-teaching staff to avoid any form of conflict that could take the ugly form of ragging.

FUNCTIONS OF ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

1. To ensure compliance with the provision of these regulations and any law for the time being in force concerning ragging and to deal and act promptly with the incidents of ragging brought to its notice.
2. To keep tabs on the happening of events related to, in Campus or Off- campus or other designed places in the premises
3. To conduct such enquiry observing a fair and transparent procedure and the

principles of natural justice and after giving adequate opportunity to the student or students accused of ragging and other witness to place before it the facts, documents and views concerning the incident of Ragging and considering such other relevant information as may be required.

4. To monitor and observe in the functions and performance of the Anti- Ragging committee in prevention and curbing or ragging in the institution.
5. To conduct an on the spot enquiry into any incident of ragging referred to it by the Head of the Institution or any member of the Faculty or any member of the Staff or any student or any parent or guardian or any employee of a service provider or any other person, as the case may be: and the enquiry report along with recommendations shall be submitted to the Anti- Ragging Committee for action under clauses(a)of Regulation 9.1 of UGC.
6. Also to monitor the welfare of fresh students outside the campus.
7. To be vigilant at all hours including at odd hours all around the campus and other places vulnerable to incidents of, and having the potential of ragging and shall be empowered to inspect such places.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING

The Institution shall punish the student found Guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

1. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment
2. otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Committee
3. The Anti-Ragging Committee depending on the nature and gravity of
4. The guilt will follow up the punishment based on the committee's decision.
5. Further the Institution can refer to the Affiliating University to act according to the UGC Regulations and State Act on curbing the menace of ragging
