## Introduction:

The NSS (National Service Scheme) unit, in collaboration with the Department of Zoology, RRC (Red Ribbon Club), and the Health Centre of SGK Government Degree College, Vinukonda, organized a free eye camp on September 9, 2022. This initiative was carried out in association with Help Foundation, Sattenapalli, and Sri Kamakshi Eye Care. The primary aim of the event was to provide essential eye care services to the college students, staff, and the local community.

## Objective:

The primary objectives of the free eye camp were as follows:

To promote eye health awareness among college students and the local community.

To offer free eye check-ups and consultations.

To distribute free eyeglasses and medication to those in need.

To identify individuals with severe eye conditions and facilitate referrals for further treatment

## Activities Conducted:

The free eye camp comprised several activities and services, including:

**Registration:** Participants were registered as they arrived, ensuring proper documentation of their details for follow-up purposes.

**Eye Check-ups:** A team of experienced ophthalmologists from Sri Kamakshi Eye Care conducted comprehensive eye examinations for all attendees. This included tests for visual acuity, eye pressure, and other relevant assessments.

**Distribution of Eyeglasses:** Participants diagnosed with vision problems were provided with free eyeglasses tailored to their prescription.

**Medical Consultations:** Those with more severe eye conditions were given personalized consultations with the ophthalmologists, who offered guidance and recommendations for further treatment when necessary.

**Awareness Programs:** Throughout the event, short informational sessions were held to educate attendees about the importance of eye care, common eye conditions, and preventative measures.
